MLTA Chair Report

Major Accomplishments

- Launch and maintenance of the MLTA website (www.mlta.ca). From 1 Aug 2013 to 19 Nov 2013 the website had 13,424 visitors.
- Revised our communication strategy so that newsletters and memos to library boards are sent via email to their library administrators instead of using Canada Post.
- Some personalized telephone and face-to-face contact with individual library boards and administrators re: fee payment, requesting support from MLTA for arising issues of local concern, attending events.
- Finalized the revisions to the MLTA constitution and by-laws for adoption at this AGM.
- Lobbied at the national level in an effort to make legislators aware of the needs and importance of public libraries and the services that they should provide to address the needs of a variety of patrons.

This has been a year of great learning for me, in this my first year as MLTA Chair, especially in the area of **advocacy** and speaking up on behalf of MLTA and Manitoba's public libraries. I am grateful for the support and advice provided by the MLTA Board of Directors, the Public Library Services Branch of Manitoba Tourism, Culture, Sport and Consumer Protection, and my colleagues on the Western Manitoba Regional Library Board.

More AGM Highlights from MLTA Chair's Report

Looking ahead to 2014, our priorities include:

- Having an MLTA **strategic planning** session to set goals and an action plan.
- Participation in the planning of the May 2014 Manitoba Libraries Conference through organizing and sponsoring a half-day session on a topic related to the work of library trustees.
- Preparation and distribution of advocacy materials relating to "value of a library in a community".
- Evaluation of our services, website and communication strategy with library boards.
- Monitoring the effect that municipal amalgamations will have on library service in rural Manitoba and how we can support library boards through the process.
- Continuation of discussions with the Manitoba Libraries Working Group regarding the formation of one libraries association in Manitoba.

Royal Society of Canada Expert Panel on the Status and Future of Canada's Libraries and Archives

They also want to hear about the challenges currently being faced in determining and delivering the services expected by Canadians.

Winnipeg Public Library Board in for a Busy Year

2014 is shaping up to be a busy year for the Winnipeg Public Library Board. Board member Joan Blakely has volunteered to assist the Library with its upcoming **strategic planning process** and has recently attended a two day introductory planning session. Work on the Library's Strategic Plan will continue throughout 2014 culminating with a report and new five year vision for the library due by November 2014. Early in spring, Board members will come together themselves to prepare a new strategic vision for the Board as their current four year plan is winding down in 2014. A one day workshop is being planned.

Work continues in 2014 on the Board-sponsored project to have a **book written on the history of Winnipeg Public Library**. Eve Dutton, writer, has been gathering information, interviewing library patrons and staff, and will be participating in a number of Library Advisory Committee (LAC) sponsored chats later in March and April 2014. The goal is to have a final manuscript prepared by the end of 2014. The book will be published in 2015 in time for the 100th anniversary of the Cornish and St. John's libraries.


New Library Opens in Selkirk

 Every public library in Manitoba has an opinion survey on their website

As a result of a request from the Public Library Advisory Board (PLAB) of Manitoba, a province-wide initiative has been implemented whereby each public library has an on-line customer satisfaction survey link on its website. This survey is coordinated by Manitoba Public Library Services through "Counting Opinions". The data collected from each library will be most useful for strategic planning purposes by library boards. To date, Manitoba and Massachusetts are the only jurisdictions that feature state or province-wide implementation of this.
