

Contract Instructor, Library & Information Technology Program (Term Contract)

We are seeking contract instructors to teach in the Library and Information Technology program. Course topics include records management, archives, communications, school libraries, and multimedia. Our diploma program also provides three in-person field placement courses that can be completed in a wide range of library settings. These field placements require instructors to provide oversight and mentorship to students in collaboration with site supervisors.

COURSE INSTRUCTION: Our courses are delivered **online and asynchronously** through LEARN.

POSITION LOCATION: Remote instruction – the instructor must reside in Manitoba.

SALARY: \$35.57 - \$36.88 / hour. Each course provides a set instructional load per student. The instructional hours typically range from **3 to 6 hours per student.**

INSTRUCTOR DUTIES: Instructors are responsible for providing engaging online instruction, mentoring and supervising students during field placements, conducting formative and summative evaluations, advising students, maintaining accurate records, and carrying out other professional duties related to course delivery and student success.

- Master of Library Science
- Recent and relevant library experience (5 years minimum)
- Strong verbal and written communication skills
- Excellent interpersonal skills with the ability to use conflict resolution techniques to facilitate positive outcomes
- Strong presentation skills
- Able to teach remotely
- Able to work independently as well as in small group settings
- Demonstrated experience using Microsoft Office Suite
- Experience building a respectful workplace culture that promotes diversity, learning and continuous improvement
